A. Mayeaux revisited the discussion from the previous Graduate Council meeting about the possibility of creating new Graduate Faculty categories for emeritus and non-tenured/tenure track temporary UL Employees. She noted that in her program there was a strong need for additional faculty to serve on graduate students' committees and contribute their expertise. Several other members of the Graduate Council noted that their departments relied on faculty who were not tenured or tenure track to serve on committees. The general consensus was that creating these distinct categories would be beneficial, assuming that these graduate faculty would serve as chair. M. Farmer-Kaiser said that she has met with P. Lanier and that her committee will continue to work on this proposal.
